



#### 10 HAMPDEN PARK

**Used by** Scotland, Queen's Park **Capacity** 51,866 **Year opened** 1903 **Top fact** Hampden still holds the record for the largest crowd ever for a football match in Europe – 149,415 saw Scotland beat England 3-1 here in 1937.



#### Used by Liverpool Capacity 54,074 Year opened 1884 Top fact The new Main Stand, opened in 2016, has boosted the matchday excitement. That area was quiet, compared to the Kop, but it's a noisy place now.



## 9 ST JAMES' PARK

Used by Newcastle United Capacity 52,405 Year opened 1892 Top fact St James' Park is right in the centre of Newcastle, at the highest position in the city and the same place it has been for over 100 years.



#### 7 ETIHAD STADIUM

Used by Manchester City Capacity 55,097 Year opened 2002 Top fact Like the homes of Barcelona and Real Madrid, the Etihad pitch is below street level, meaning the stadium feels taller on the inside than it appears from the outside.

# 6 EMIRATES STADIUM

Used by Arsenal Capacity 60,260 Year opened 2006 Top fact It has never hosted an England international, but Brazil have played friendlies here so their Europe-based players don't need to fly all the way to South America.

## **3 LONDON STADIUM**

Used by West Ham Capacity 66,000 Year opened 2012 Top fact Some think that the pitch is too far from the stands but home fans still roar the team on with their famous "bubbles" song.

## **5 CELTIC PARK**

Used by Celtic Capacity 60,411 Year opened 1892 Top fact Celtic fans have their own standing section. It generates a good, loud atmosphere, with plenty of singing and giant banners.

# 2 OLD TRAFFORD

Used by Manchester United Capacity 74,994 Year opened 1910 Top fact The stadium was hit by bombs during the Second World War, which meant it was closed between 1941 and 1949.



#### **4 TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR STADIUM**

Used by Tottenham Hotspur Capacity 62,062 Year opened 2019 Top fact Work began on Spurs' new stadium in 2015. It is built partly on the site of their old ground, White Hart Lane.

# 1 WEMBLEY STADIUM
