
FOOTBALL LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP 2005-06

WHY IT MATTERED

Reading fans will always remember the 2005-06 season. Not only did the team get promoted to the Premier League for the first time, they also broke two Football League records.

One was for the **most points** in a season. The other was for the **longest run between defeats** – an amazing 33 matches! As you might expect, their manager **Steve Coppell** was voted as the Manager of the Year.





THE STORY OF THE SEASON

Reading got off to a bad start, losing their first match 2-1 at home to **Plymouth**. But they then went on an amazing run, with only one more loss. That came six months later when they were beaten 3-2 at **Luton**.

Reading didn't go to the top of the table until 22nd November – that day, they won at **Ipswich** while the previous leaders **Sheffield United** drew at **Wolves**. The two teams remained first and second for the rest of the season.

Reading won the league in style with a 5-0 victory over **Derby** in April. Going into their last game at home to **Queens Park Rangers**, Reading needed to score three goals to reach 100 for the season. But they fell just one short, winning 2-1. Five Reading players were voted into the Championship Team of the Season.

In the play-off semi-finals, Watford beat Crystal Palace while Leeds knocked out Preston. In the final, Watford easily beat Leeds 3-0.

It was a nightmare year for the three teams who got relegated – **Crewe**, **Millwall** and **Brighton** were in the bottom three places for most of the season. The Royals' incredible season saw them go 33 matches unbeaten and fly past the 100-point mark, leaving their rivals in the dust!

WHAT HAPPENED NEXT?

Reading continued their good form the following season in the **Premier League**. They finished eighth and just missed out on qualifying for the **UEFA Cup** (now the Europa League) by one point! This led to **Steve Coppell** being voted as Manager of the Year again.

The other two promoted teams, **Watford** and **Sheffield United**, both struggled and were relegated.

Surprisingly, Reading also went down the next year, 2007-08. They have only spent one season in the Premier League since, in 2012-13, and are now in the **Championship**.
