With their instantly recognisable yellow and green colours, Norwich City's fans and players brighten up any stadium. The club have been promoted or relegated in eight of the last 15 seasons - things are never boring at Carrow Road!

THE MANAGER

German **Daniel Farke** joined the Canaries at the start of last season. The 41-year-old previously managed Borussia Dortmund's under-23 team and before that spent six years in charge of SV Lippstadt, who he used to play for as a striker.

THE HISTORY

Norwich City were formed in 1902 and started off playing in light blue and white halved shirts! In 1971-72 the Canaries, captained by Duncan Forbes, reached the top tier of English football for the first time. Having won the **League Cup** in 1962 they lifted the trophy again in 1985, beating Sunderland 1-0 in what became known



DID YOU KNOW?

Norwich are called the Canaries because the city has a long history of canary breeding. It started when refugees from the Netherlands invited to Norwich in the 16th century brought their chirpy yellow birds with them!

into a former chalk mine with steep cliffs that fans stood on top of. The FA forced the club to find a new home because it was too dangerous!

THE FANS

Norwich fans are well known for their loyal support – when they went down to League One, the average attendance at Carrow Road actually went up! Their anthem *On the Ball City* is the world’s oldest football song still in use today. It was written way back in the 1890s.

THE RIVALS

Although the clubs are 45 miles apart, the Norfolk side have a fierce rivalry with Ipswich Town, who are from the neighbouring county of Suffolk. The Canaries haven’t lost to the Blues since 2009, although four of the last five East Anglian derbies have ended 1-1. They have twice met in semi-finals for a place at Wembley – in the 1984-85 Milk Cup and the 2014-15 Championship play-offs – and City won both times!

THE STAR PLAYERS

Summer signing Teemu Pukki had a great start to the season, with the clinical Finnish striker scoring in six of his first ten games. Mo Leitner pulls the strings in midfield – he won a league and cup double under Jürgen Klopp at Borussia Dortmund in 2011-12, when he was just 19!

as the “Friendly Final”, with the two sets of supporters playing football together outside **Wembley Stadium!**

Norwich came close to winning the first ever Premier League in 1992-93. Their third-place finish got them into the **UEFA Cup** where they knocked out Bayern Munich.

A low point came in 2009 with relegation to League One, but City bounced back all the way to the **Premier League**, where they’ve spent four of the last seven seasons.
