There was a time when **Preston** were probably the best football team anywhere! The Football League is the world's oldest league and Preston were **champions** in the first two seasons.

Amazingly they were unbeaten in their first year, winning the League and FA Cup Double! This earned them the nickname, the Old Invincibles. Since then only Arsenal in 2003-04 have gone through a League season unbeaten.

THE MANAGER

Alex Neil is seen as one of the best young managers in British football. As player-manager of Hamilton Academical he won promotion to the Scottish Premiership in 2014 when he was only 32!

After that Neil had a spell with Norwich, taking them to the Premier League in 2015.

THE HISTORY

Having been champions the first two years, Preston were then League runners-up three times in a row. They won the **1938 FA Cup** and had a strong team in the 1950s as League **runners-up** twice, also losing the 1954 FA Cup final to West Brom.

Those teams include Preston's bestknown player, **Tom Finney**.

DID YOU KNOW?

Preston's 26-0 win over Hyde in an FA Cup first round match in 1887 is still a record for the competition. Striker Jimmy Ross scored eight goals in that game and got a total of 19 in the FA Cup that year, also a record. Preston reached the final but lost to West Brom!


the club's all-time top scorer. He also ran his family's plumbing business and was known as **"The Preston Plumber**".

Most Preston fans won't remember when they last played in the top division (it was 58 years ago!) but many will have seen their club play in the other three divisions. In fact, Preston are one of only five clubs who have been champions in all four divisions!

Preston's record attendance is **42,684**, which was set for a match against Arsenal in **1938**. These days they average around **14,000**.

THE RIVALS

Preston's main rivals are **Blackpool**, who are 17 miles away. When the two play it is known as the West Lancashire derby. They last met in the **League Cup** in 2013, when Preston won 1-0!

PNE also have rivalries with other clubs such as **Blackburn** and **Burnley** – they are surrounded by big clubs!

THE STAR PLAYERS

Midfielder **Alan Browne** is a Republic of Ireland international who has become known for scoring spectacular goals. His long-range volley against Bolton was voted as Preston's goal of the season for 2018-19 – an award he won the year before too. The club's player of the year is 23-year-old **Ben Davies**, who has become a vital part of the PNE backline alongside his young central defence partner **Jordan Storey**.
